

Making best silage: Top tips to sheeting a clamp

Sheeting down the Clamp

1. Keep silage sheets in their original packaging until required.
2. Lift with care to avoid personal injury.
3. Unwrap carefully, and place the product packaging with other waste polythene for subsequent recycling.
4. Apply the sheet immediately after clamp filling is complete.
5. Unroll in a forwards direction moving across the clamp evenly flattening the film down carefully as you move forwards.
6. Avoid excessive contact with the film surface by footwear, heavy or sharp objects.
7. Ensure the film is secured tightly to the clamp edges to achieve the best possible seal.
8. Place suitable weighted blocks or mesh netting on the film to keep it in close contact with the forage surface.
